Season Preview

For the first time in program history, Lubbock Christian University women's basketball begins a season with an all-time program history over .500 (408-399), and mostly due in part to the play of the squad since head coach Steve Gomez took over the program. In six seasons at the helm, LCU has posted a 133-64 record under Gomez, which most importantly includes six consecutive appearances to the NAIA Women's Basketball National Championship Tournament in Jackson, Tennessee. LCU went 27-7 last season, which included an 18-4 second place finish in the Sooner Athletic Conference, and had their season come to an end in the "sweet sixteen" of the National Tournament.

This season may seem like a rebuilding season with the loss of All-Americans Jordan Hampton and Sierra Wilcox, but Gomez sees the 2009-2010 season as a reloading season.

"Obviously there will be some adjustments, but it is hard to identify specific areas until the season gets underway," said Gomez. "Perhaps from the outside, expectations will be lower, but we expect to maintain and improve on the success that we have experienced in the past. Each team forges its own identity and we are excited about what the season ahead holds for us."

At the Point

There is no shortage of depth at the guard spot for the Lady Chaparrals, but despite the myriad of looks the Lady Chaps could show at the point, it will primarily be junior college transfer Lauren Sparks running the office. Sparks may be under the microscope, since she takes over the job of running the offense from program assist leader Wilcox, but she shouldn't have a problem creating her own style of play to quarterback the Lady Chaps offense. The Australian native led Hutchinson Community College in assists (111) last season and also had a 41.9% three-point percentage. Brittany Hampton could also run the LCU offense. The sophomore from Canyon, Texas, who averaged five points a game last season, hit 27 three-pointers and was an 84.1% free-throw shooter (58-for-69).

"We expect to be solid at the point guard position on both ends of the floor," Gomez remarked. "Each of them defend well, shoot the three at a high percentage, and are able to get to the basket off the dribble."

Shooting Guard / Small Forward

The slew of guards are versatile enough to be used in several different positions. Ashley Coggins, Brandi Raindl, Renee Wilson and April Ehlers are all returning players that can serve various roles on the perimeter or at the small forward spot. Coggins

and Raindl are the lone seniors on the squad. A Coppell, Texas native, Coggins averaged 9.4 points per game last season and shot 37.6% from three-point range. Raindl, an area product from Tahoka, Texas, ranked 36th in the NAIA last season with a 1.6 assist/turnover ratio. Wilson saw action last season in 12 contests and the Lubbock native was 4-for-8 from three-point range on the season. Sophomore Ehlers from Lubbock's Cooper High School brings 29 games of experience from her freshman season.

Newcomers at the guard spot include Rachel Bookout, Rachel Gray, and Tara Johnson. Bookout comes from Austin High School in Austin, Texas, where she contributed 10.7 points and 3.8 rebounds per game as a senior. Gray has the ability to serve all aspects of the perimeter. The junior transfer from South Plains College averaged 7.7 points and 5.5 rebounds a game at SPC last season and was second on the team in assists with 91. Johnson is a freshman from Portales, New Mexico, who brings athleticism from successful state championship runs.

"We will have very good depth on the perimeter which should allow us to play with a lot of energy on the defensive end and in transition," said Gomez. "Our perimeter shooting ability should once again be a strength for us and we expect to be improved at offensive rebounding with this team."

In the Paint

The Lady Chaps have options inside to allow them to get points around the basket. Returning players inside include Severyn Smith, Shamika Singleton and Whitney Wehmeyer. Smith, a junior from Amarillo, averaged 7.7 points last season and shot 85.7% (66-for-77) from the free-throw line. She was second on the team in conference road scoring with 10.8 points a game on the road, which included going 12-for-23 (.522) from three-point range on the road in SAC play and was 27-for-31 (87.1%) from the charity stripe. Singleton received valuable playing time as a freshman last season. The Hemphill, Texas native appeared in all 34 games and was second on the team with 16 blocks. Wehmeyer transferred in from Oral Roberts University in December last year and saw action in 23 games and shot 87.5% (14-of-16) from the free-throw line. Joining the trio in the paint is Courtney Wilson, who is a sophomore that transfers in after spending her freshman season at NCAA Div. I Houston Baptist University.

"The versatility of our inside players and their ability to score around the basket and also on the perimeter will hopefully create difficulty for opponents defenses," stated Gomez. "We also have players at perimeter positions who are very comfortable playing with their back to the basket and hopefully we will be able to take advantage of those opportunities also."
